#### Latin Script

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The Latin alphabet is used in the writing systems of more languages than any other single script.

Only a small number of them use its basic 26-letter form.

# a b c d e f g hijklmnop qrstuvw XYZ

Swedish is one such language.

It uses a 29-letter alphabet.

# abcdefg hijklmnop qrstuvw xyzåäö

Diacritical marks are used with a number of these letters, primarily proper names of non-Swedish origin.

The distinction between "decorative" and "contrastive" use of diacritical marks is extremely important.

In some cases "decomposing" a marked letter is permissible and in others it is not.
